

Make sure you leave a finger space between each word.




Maths: Investigation – I am 8.

Today we are going to use all the number operations we know.

What is 8? This challenge is about finding a variety of ways of asking questions which make 8.

You might think of $6 + 2$ or $10 - 2$ or $2 + 2 + 2 + 2$

Perhaps you can challenge yourself to find ways of making 8 that no-one else would think about.

Computing: Debugging algorithms

We have found out about algorithms are a list of instructions. If we put the instructions in the wrong order, we might not get the outcome we had hoped for.

We have also found out that if our instructions are not clear, we could end up with a different outcome than we expected.

Today we are going to play a game that will help us understand the term **debugging**.


Debugging is changing a list of instructions to correct any mistakes that might've happened.

Click on the link to play the game. When the page opens, you will need to click on **get started**. This will give you the first levels – create a list of actions to move the car. If you don't succeed – you will need to **debug** your instructions.

An active idea: Hot and Cold Game

The object of the game is to find hidden objects.

Ask your helper or a member of your family to hide an object somewhere while you close your eyes.

You then begin to search for the object – if you are far away from the object the hider will say “Cold” and if you are near the hidden object, they will say “HOT!”. When you are very hot, you should be able to find the object. When you have found it, you can hide it for them to search for.

I can help by putting my dirty clothes in the wash basket




I can make a picture using leaves and flowers and press it.
