Try to balance if you can – you might need to use another part of your body to help you. Your helper can also change how you move around the area. You could skip, hop or move sideways.

'does not envy' and 'keeps no record of wrongs.'


What do both of those things mean?

I can make a picture using leaves and flowers and press it.




I can draw a map to show someone where some treasure is.
