English: Hidden World: Ocean

Today we are going to join our sentences together to make longer sentences.

Yesterday we improved our simple sentences about an animal. These were mine

Woodlice are small, grey minibeasts. They have six legs.

Woodlice live under logs. They like being in the dark.

Woodlice are very common creatures. They have different names in different parts of the country.

These sentences are sounding much better, but I think we can make them even better. Joining sentences together can make them sound a lot more interesting. To do this, we can use 'and' to join them together. Like this:

Woodlice are small, grey minibeasts and they have six legs.

Read the sentence, does this sound better?

When we join the two sentences together, we need to think carefully about our punctuation. We now have a capital letter at the start of the sentence and a full stop at the end of our longer sentences.

Create longer sentences using your own animal sentences from yesterday. Read them out loud to see how much better they sound.

Make sure you include finger spaces and use your sound mat and tricky words to help you.

Maths: Tens and Ones

Today we are going to be looking at tens and ones to find bigger numbers.

- Toothpick





